Mont. Co. Records Office, Katie Baker Fan (Fraud Alert Notification Program)

Katie Baker attended the meeting on behalf of the Montgomery County Recorder's Office to provide an overview of several programs and services offered by the office:

- **Fraud Alert Notification Program (FAN):** Sends alerts to property owners to help prevent fraudulent activity.
- **Transfer on Death (TOD):** Services that allow property owners to designate beneficiaries.
- **Veterans ID Program and DD214 Recording Services:** Offers identification cards for veterans and records their DD214 discharge papers.
- **Defraud Protection Initiatives:** Programs designed to protect citizens from property-related fraud.

Recorder Lori Kennedy works in collaboration with the County Auditor to conduct paperwork inspections. These efforts have been in place since January 2025.

Blume Community Consultants, Liz Blume Housing Market Study

Liz Blume with Blume Community Consultants and Liz Fields with McBride, Dale, Clarion. Ms. Blume and Ms. Fields attended the meeting to deliver a summary of the housing market study. The study covered current housing needs, inventory, affordability, aging housing stock, and development opportunities within the township. Their analysis will help guide strategic planning and future grant applications, including efforts tied to the Land Bank and the "Welcome Home Ohio" initiative.

Administrators Report and Department Updates

Board Discussion and Department Updates:

Chad stated that two BZA rezoning cases were approved. Progress is being made with permitting processes, and there has been a noticeable increase in development inquiries in the Ashcraft area. Zoning trends show the county is working on updating its coordination plan to collaborate more effectively with cities and townships.

Chief Crist informed the board of improvements are ongoing at the fire stations. A firefighter who has been with the department for many years is currently in critical condition; the Chief requested everyone keep him in their prayers. Small but positive changes are taking place within the department.

Robert thanked Liz and her team for completing the housing study. The study highlights potential development opportunities and will support upcoming grant applications, including one with the U.S. EPA. Recent grant training was a useful tool to assist with this effort. Work is ongoing with the Land Bank and the Welcome Home Ohio program to pursue additional grant funding. The D10 project is still moving forward, and a Zoning Commission meeting is scheduled for tonight. Preparations are underway for the next round of demolitions next month. Out of six nuisance cases from last month, two have been brought into compliance by the owners rather than the full township enforcement.

Captain Daugherty stated that the Northland patrol vehicle is expected to be completed this week and should be operational by October.

Nathan informed the board that there is tremendous demand for events in the township. National Night Out drew approximately 500 attendees, demonstrating strong community engagement. A total of 152 ID chips were distributed at the fire station during the event. Coordination is underway with the fire department for their open house scheduled for October 11, 2025. On the economic development side, a ribbon cutting for QT is scheduled for September 18. The Northridge School Board vote will take place in September.

Mark Coleman, the new Parks and Recreation vehicle is now in service. A streetlight audit is scheduled for the first week of September. The asphalt pre-construction meeting is set for September 4. The third round of street sweeping will begin in the second week of September.

Shonda stated she is actively working on assessments (street lighting, demolitions, nuisance, bulk and grass). An update was received regarding the Cybersecurity Grant; funds will be released soon. RSVPs have been received for the upcoming Volunteer Appreciation Cookout.

There being no further workshop business, Ms. Bradley made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Winburn seconded. Motion carried 3-0.

Ms. Godsey turned the meeting over to Mr. Chad Adkins for the Zoning Commission public hearing for the following cases:

ZC-03-25: Resolution #73-2025

The applicant requests rezoning to allow the use of the existing building and site as a Daycare Center for children. The new owner, David Jones, has been under a land contract since early April 2025. The property is currently owned by Airpower Investments, LLC, who have also approved the rezoning request.

The rezoning of the property to B-2 is consistent with the intent of the 2022 Future Land Use Plan. Key considerations include:

- Rezoning to B-2 provides appropriate zoning for the intended use as a Daycare Center.
- The proposed use aligns with the Future Land Use Plan for properties along this primary thoroughfare.
- The site's current condition makes redevelopment difficult.

Staff recommends approval of the rezoning from R-7 to B-2.

The applicant, David Jones, 800 Shoup Mill Rd., holds an engineering degree, which he has not utilized professionally. He has 20 years of experience in childcare and has operated a daycare in Trotwood for the past 7 years with a good standing. The proposed daycare hours are from 5:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m.

There being no proponents or opponents, Ms. Godsey closed the public hearing.

Ms. Bradley made a motion to approve Resolution #73-2025. Mr. Winburn seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously (3-0).

ZC-04-25: Resolution #74-2025

This case was initiated by staff, requesting rezoning to allow reinvestment in the property located at 5990 Markey Road, a vacant commercial building situated at a key intersection. The proposed use of the existing building and site is for an Adult Daycare Center. The new owner, Sampson Dorsey, purchased the property in April 2025 with the intent to bring it into compliance with all applicable codes.

Rezoning is also requested for the adjacent property at 6000 Philadelphia Drive, another commercial building currently owned by the National Youth Advocate Program (Website Link: National Youth Advocate Program: Family Services & Advocacy). Both properties require repairs, and appropriate rezoning is the first step toward revitalization.

The current owner would like to use the property at 5990 Markey Road as a Daycare Center for adults which requires compliance with all Zoning, Building, and Fire. Since the current R-2 Single-Family Residential District does not permit a Daycare Center as either permitted use or conditional use, rezoning is necessary. Rezoning both properties to the O-2 Office District aligns with the commercial nature of the buildings, as shown in the accompanying maps and photographs.

Staff recommends approval of the rezoning from R-2 to O-2. The intended uses—for an Adult Daycare Center and office space—are appropriate for these sites and their location within Harrison Township. This rezoning will allow reinvestment in both properties, aiming for full compliance with all relevant codes. The O-2 zoning designation provides the best match of permitted uses, enabling the owners to improve the properties and operate their businesses while respecting the surrounding single-family residential neighborhood.

The applicant, Marshala Autman, 5351 Northford Rd., Dayton 45426, stated she has a background in rehabilitation services and is a nurse. She plans to provide a space for older adults for occupational and physical therapy. Additionally, office space will be used for Ohio Career and School programs such as phlebotomy and CPR classes. Marshala clarified that this will be an adult daycare, not a group home, operating during typical business hours. The goal is for caregivers to bring elderly clients to the facility.

The applicant, Sampson Dorsey stated he will be responsible for rehabbing the building and obtaining all necessary permits.

There being no proponents or opponents. Ms. Godsey closed the public hearing.

Mr. Winburn made a motion to approve Resolution #74-2025. Ms. Bradley seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously (3-0).

Hearing of the Public

Husani Kitwana, 3040 Garvin Road, stated he would like to speak to Mr. Winburn outside of the public meeting.

Sandra Kitwana, 3040 Garvin Road, thanked the trustees and staff for their continued dedication to Harrison Township. Mrs. Kitwana stated that she resides in the Garvin Condominiums on Garvin Road and is currently a student at the University of Dayton as well as a professional vocalist, often keeping late-night hours.

She expressed concern regarding ongoing issues in Building 1 of the complex, noting that it is negatively impacting the community. She reported frequent disturbances, including gunfire between 2:00 a.m. and 4:00 a.m., and general disruptive behavior continuing into the evening hours. Mrs. Kitwana attributed the problems to one property owner who is allegedly attracting and allowing such activity on the premises.

Willa Smith, 5045 Brock Lane, stated she has lived at her current address for 29 years and grew up on Philadelphia Drive. She raised concerns regarding semi-trucks parking at 5040 Philadelphia Drive, in front of the Carriage Hill Nursing Home. She noted that the property appears to be used as a commercial parking lot, and a semi-truck has been parked there consistently for several months. Other truck drivers have taken notice and also begun parking there.

Mrs. Smith stated that Deputy Shivley informed her trucks are allowed to park there legally unless deemed a hazard. However, she believes the parking situation does pose a hazard to the community.

She also reported issues related to a group home on W. Floyd Avenue. She witnessed three boys from the group home on her lawn smoking marijuana. Although she does not know the individuals' backgrounds, she noted that the street now has an unusually high number of parked vehicles, presumably related to the group home. She expressed that W. Floyd was once a quiet street with minimal traffic, which has significantly changed.

Larry Smith, also of 5045 Brock Lane, echoed the concerns raised by Mrs. Smith. He shared that while he has had very few issues over his 29 years in the township, the recent presence of group homes and semi-trucks has become a growing nuisance.
